#### BIST Tip: Statements of Acceptance

We all want to be accepted. Children long for this more than anyone. When a child struggles with an emotion or negative behavior, it is so often that he feels badly about himself or she feels like no one can like her because of it. Loving adults in their lives can counter these thoughts and feelings by statements of acceptance. "It's okay that you are having this problem. What's not okay is to stay stuck with it." "I love you even though this is difficult for you." "Having a problem doesn't make you a bad person. It just means that you need help from someone who cares, like me." Using these type of statements helps a child to recognize that a problem is a problem, but does not define who they are.
