Last Friday, Mr. Naumann was one of three Veterans who received a "Quilt of Valor" at the program put on by the Prime Timers for Veterans in our community. "this tradition began in 2003 with a dream, literally a dream. Founder Catherine Roberts' son Nat was deployed in Iraq. According to Catherine: The dream was as vivid as real life. I saw a young man sitting on the side of his bed in the middle of the night, hunched over. The permeating feeling was one of utter despair. I could see his war demons clustered around, dragging him down into an emotional gutter. Then, as if viewing a movie, I saw him in the next scene wrapped in a quilt. BIST Tip: Gateway Behavior #1

A gateway behavior "opens the gates" to negative thoughts, words, or actions. When a child rolls his eyes, turns her shoulder away when you are speaking, or sighs, this indicates a deeper attitude. Asking children about what constitutes these behaviors can be very revealing. Children identify them better than we can! Having an honest conversation about how these behaviors can lead to getting in trouble is the first step to making children aware of their impact. The next step will be noticing and taking action.
