THEN the real celebration begins as the tiny, tender child is held close and one feels like you could gaze for hours on those precious little features.

As we are just shy of two weeks before Christmas, now is a great time to redouble our efforts to prepare our hearts for the graces Jesus has in store for us this Christmas. While it may sometimes feel like just another holiday, the graces God gives are real, and, when we go to Mass on Christmas, we are TRULY present at Jesus' birth. BIST Tip: Calm tone

What do you mean "calm tone?" If I've asked a student to do something for the <u>umpteenth</u> time, I'm far from calm! Just remember, that a child can either deal with the adult's strong emotion or deal with the problem behavior. They cannot do both! We know from experience, we are better listeners and problem solvers when we are calm. So if you find your tone is far from calm, it's okay to take some time for yourself to relax before talking with the child. Stop, relax, think...and then problem solve. You are your child's best role model!

Both nights the gym doors and front school doors will be unlocked at 6:30 pm. Attendance is mandatory per the school handbook.

Please have your 5th and/or 6th grade child(ren) in the school cafeteria by 6:50 pm the night of their program. K-4th graders are to be in their classrooms by 6:50 pm. We'd prefer they stay with you until 6:40 to ensure proper supervision. Students with costumes will need to go to the music room first to put their costume on.

Costume reminders:

Sheep: Come in a T-shirt, black pants/sweats/leggings, and black socks. We have the sheep costume you will wear over that.

Doves: Come in white/grey pants/sweats/leggings, white socks, and a white shirt. We have the dove costume you will wear over that.

Cows: Come to the concert in shorts, a T-shirt and black or white socks. We have the cow costume you will wear over that.

Donkeys: Come to the concert in black leggings, pants, or sweats, black socks, and a black long-sleeved shirt. We have the rest of the donkey costume you will wear over that.

Camels: Come in a T-shirt, shorts, and tan/brown socks. We have the camel costume you will wear over that.

All other characters: Characters in either musical that I have not mentioned yet (ex. main characters, Mary, Joseph, kings, shepherds, angels, misc. characters) we have the costume for you. Please wear shorts and a t-shirt to go underneath your costume. You are also to wear a type of sandal or socks to complete your costume.

Hand bell players and choir members: Come dressed-up in nice Christmas dresses or slacks outfits. Please do not wear jeans, shorts, sweats, jerseys, etc.

Additional information:

K-3 will perform the musical **"Hooray in a Manger,"** while the 4th-6th graders watch. We will take 5 minutes to switch the staging while the 4th-6th graders take their places on the risers. The K-3rd graders will then watch the **4th-6th** graders perform **"Camel Lot."** We will be done approximately 8:10 pm. Out of respect for the latter performers please stay until both musicals are completed. Your presence is greatly appreciated - thank you!

Students may not participate in a program if sent home sick or gone for more than half of the school day.

Who performs in a talent show?


