Do you know the story behind giving Valentines?

In the 3rd Century, when it was still illegal to be a Christian, St. Valentine was a priest that was imprisoned for his faith. Many stories are attributed to him. Some say he was arrested because he married couples, even though the emperor degreed that marriage was illegal for young men so they could serve in his army. While in prison, St. Valentine befriended his jailer, who had a daughter that was blind. At one point, St. Valentine cured her of her blindness. Before he was executed, he wrote the girl a note that was signed, "From your Valentine." His acts of love have become immortalized ever since.



Regardless of the legends, celebrating the beauty of love is a good thing. To tell someone, "I love you," is perhaps the most powerful statement one can make. As Catholics, we know that this runs much deeper than romance. Love is seen in the sacrifice you make when your child is cranky and doesn't want to go to school. It's seen in the nights you stay up with a child who is sick. It's seen in the sacrifices you make to pay for a Catholic education. And, it's seen in your child's response of a hug, or a handmade card, or a thank you when you least expect it.

Deeper yet, love is actually personified in Jesus Christ, who took on human flesh and gave up His life out of love for us! As Scripture reminds us, "Greater love has

no one than this, to lay down his life for his friends." But St. Paul reminds us that God goes even further, "God proved His love for us that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." So, even when we were God's enemies

(sinners) He was still willing to die for us. St. John follows upon this with a challenge, "If God so loved us, then we must love one another."

Genuine love – which wills the good of another – is not necessarily easy. And it's not often surrounded by chocolates and roses. But real love, which we all long for, IS possible by the grace of God. I pray that you may know and live this love this St. Valentine's Day!

However, it can be very freeing to realize that a difficult emotion like anger or sadness does not need to paralyze me or cause me to react in negative ways. Coupled with this goal is giving the child options and tools for dealing with the strong emotion, such as deep breaths, a quiet place to calm down or simply a couple minutes to process what is going on. By teaching children to work with their emotions and still choose what is right, we are empowering them to regulate their behavior and respond to difficulties in life; something that we all need at times!








Special Conference for Adults
