
Today, I used the parable of the Weeds and the Wheat to pray with the 5th and 6th grade classes for my monthly reflection with them. If you recall the story, the farmer sowed good wheat in his field, but when he was asleep an enemy came and sowed weeds. When they began to grow, the servants asked the farmer if they should pull up the weeds, but he replied, "No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest…"

Now, I must admit, coming from a farming family, I don't care for that advice. After all, the weeds take valuable nutrients and moisture away from the good plants! But Jesus had a deeper message in mind. I asked the students to think of someone that seems like a "weed" to them (someone who irritates them in some way). I asked them to picture bringing that person to Jesus and seeing how He responds. Jesus hugs that person and loves them. He knows it is hard for us to love, but, unlike weeds, sometimes when we treat others with love and respect we may find that they don't bother us as much. We may even start to see the good in them, and possibly can even become friends.

Sometimes, taking a step back and praying for someone who bothers us is the antidote to our irritation. Bringing them to Jesus helps to put them, and our own thinking, into perspective. I don't know about you, but at this time of year I find that to be very helpful!

2024-2025 Registration Open!

Saint Joseph's online enrollment is now open for grades K-8!! Online Registration is like last year: you **MUST** have a Parent Portal Account in order to enroll your child(ren) for next year.

We are changing how we distribute our important documents: Tuition Agreement and ACH, Emergency Contact Form (for 24-25), and the Computer Acceptable Use Policy (for 24-25). **Once your online registration has been done for your WHOLE family you will then receive your copies of the important documents mentioned previously. Tuition Agreements and Emergency Contact Forms will be prepopulated with the information we have on file. It is up to you to make the necessary changes on those forms so we have information that is as accurate as possible. We will use PowerSchool and these forms to make sure our School Directory and class distribution lists for teachers for next year are accurate. These forms will be distributed once a week to the families who have finished their registration process for the whole family.

This year it is VERY important to register your child(ren) online. Without registering your child(ren) you will not receive the important documents for the 2024-25 school year. Without registering online, and returning the completed important documents, your family will not be on our posted class lists this August. Please make sure to register your family online as soon as you can to help with a smooth transition into summer.

Online Registration is due by April 29th. Tuition Agreements are due by May 20th.

Notes from the Nurse's Desk

PRE-K PARENTS & 6th GRADE PARENTS:

Students entering <u>Kindergarten</u> and <u>7th grade</u> are required to have a <u>physical exam</u> completed within 6 months of the first day of school as well as an <u>up-to-date immunization record</u> on file. A copy of the physical and immunization record is due in the school office by the first day of school. 7th GRADE PARENTS:

Students entering 8th grade that are planning to participate in school organized sports are required to have a sports physical on file. These may be completed after May 1st for the upcoming school year.

MEDICAL FORMS:

These can be found on the school website located under the **Forms** tab for the 2024-2025 school year. Non-prescription medication authorizations can also be filled out on PowerSchool.
