WFC, not KFC

Do any of you remember weeples?

In my first years of teaching at St. Joseph's, we did annual magazine sales as a fundraiser. To encourage participating, students got these little toys called weeples (I don't know if I'm spelling it correctly!), and the fundraising lady would come around on certain days to "feed" the weeples by giving students prizes if they sold a certain number of magazines. As you could imagine, it was a great distraction in the classroom. Aren't you glad we don't do magazine sales anymore? I certainly am!

Instead, we have WFC – Walk for Christ! No cookie dough sales. No plant sales. And no magazine sales! Rather than try to sell people things they don't need or want in order to support our school, many years ago we shifted to this yearly fundraiser that incorporates prayer, family and fun! We know that people love St. Joseph School and want to support Catholic education to raise the next generation of saints. Why not ask them to simply donate to support us and we will offer our prayers and love in return?

Do you know the actual cost to educate a child here in K-8? A little over \$7,000. That's a far cry above our modest tuition! Some families can afford much more and contribute to the parish collection to help cover the expense for their children and others. Other families can barely afford this much and also contribute what they can to the parish collection weekly. Therefore, WFC provides an opportunity for people in the parish and community to show their support for Catholic education by their contributions. Our SFA does a wonderful job of working together with the school administration, parish finance and parish building committee to support educational endeavors, building needs and various projects to make our school viable.

Meanwhile, students also collect prayer intentions from our families and benefactors – and we take this part seriously, too. Our most recent format for the day includes placing these intentions before the altar at Mass, celebrated by Bishop Conley. The whole school then walks together after Mass, and this year, different grade levels will pray a decade of the rosary for our intentions before we all meet on the back soccer field for the final decade of the rosary and a drone picture. Students then get to celebrate with a popcorn ball and times for bounce houses and dunk tank. It's a unifying and joyful event and you are welcome to attend!

Finally, I love this year's theme, "Pilgrims of Hope." During this Jubilee Year of Hope it is a good reminder that our hope is in Christ and each day is a step forward on our journey toward heaven. So, please check out the details of Walk For Christ below. Thank you for your beautiful support of our school and the extra efforts to make our family contributions meet our goals. God bless you!

BIST Tip: : "I can be okay even if others are not okay."

This is another of the BIST Goals for Life. It carries two meanings in the school setting. For some children, seeing others who are distressed, angry or disobedient causes an empathetic response. They get preoccupied with why another is having a difficult time and find it hard to focus on their own work. In this case, if a teacher reminds them of this goal, it gives them permission to keep their attention on their own learning and let the teacher handle the child who is having difficulty. A second use of this goal involves how a child responds to another who is being unkind, rude or disrespectful. In this case, reminding him or her that we can be okay even if others are not helps them to see that, while the other child's behavior is not acceptable, that child is "not okay" and needs some sort of redirection, but retaliating will not help the situation. Think of situations at home where your children may find it helpful to recall this Goal for Life.



Dear Parents of 4th - 8th Grade Students,

When schools give students access to devices and online accounts, an incredible world of learning opportunities opens up — as well as potential dangers. Digital safety is critically important to St. Joseph School, which is why we are now using <u>Bark for Schools</u> to help us protect our students both online and in real life.

Bark monitors for signs of potential issues like:

- Cyberbullying
- Suicidal ideation
- Sexual predators
- Threats of violence
- And more

Alerts at the First Signs of Danger

When possible dangers arise on school-issued accounts, Bark for Schools sends us alerts so we can address the situation in a timely manner. These alerts also give us insights that help us promote the wellness of the entire student body.

Parents and guardians can benefit from receiving these alerts as well.

Get Alerts with the Free Parent Portal

Kids use their school-issued accounts both at school and at home, and families are often in a better position to respond to urgent alerts after hours, on weekends, and during breaks. These are times when administration may not be available in the event of an emergency. In the coming days, you will receive an invitation to create your free account for the Bark for Schools Parent Portal. As soon as you opt in, you will start receiving after-hours alerts when Bark detects potentially time-sensitive issues.

Monitor Texts, Social Media, and More

Bark for Schools is free for both our school and for you. For even greater coverage, you can also sign up for Bark for Families, which monitors texts, chat, email, YouTube, and 30+ social media platforms for potential safety concerns. You can find out more about how Bark for Parents works here.

Violation Consequences

As stated in the St. Joseph Acceptable Use Policy, signed by every student and parent, "Any violation of Saint Joseph policies and regulations, these regulations, building guidelines, use agreements, handbook provisions or administrative orders or directives as issued from time to time on Computer Use by any Computer User as defined herein, including access to the Internet may result in removal of privileges, reporting enforcement agencies and additional disciplinary action, including possible expulsion of minors or students or termination of employment for staff members or employees." Such situations will be handled in a case-by-case basis.


