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KNIGHTLY NEWS FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents,

I'm writing to you on the eve of Holy Week and wish to impart two values that have been on my mind as of late. I recently attended the funeral of a family friend, and as his oldest son read the eulogy, he mentioned that his dad felt gratitude and humility are all you really need when forming relationships. This gentleman oozed charm and had many, many solid relationships as a result of following that maxim. I'm tempted here to draw a parallel between these values and our Lord's experience as he moved from public ministry into His passion and death, and knowing what was to come.

His humility in enduring death on the cross and obedience to the Father's will was certainly extreme. Yet, even in all of that, His gratitude was also present in his encounter with Simon of Cyrene, or with the good thief, as well as the women of Jerusalem. Those qualities are best lived and shown by example and modeling, as opposed to many words. If we, as the teachers and staff of St. Joseph's, can instill in our children these traits, embedded in the faith that we share, will they not be prepared to make the change the world so desperately needs? Please know that this is something that I wish to work toward in all that I do as your principal and servant in the Lord.

Many have also brought up the continuing need for information and resources regarding social media and the role that it plays in our children's lives. We hope to have more for you along these lines as we work with neighboring parishes, as well as our SFA, to have a program for parents to help support the formation of our children in this area. Sadly, humility and gratitude don't seem to permeate social media in many ways, certainly not the extent to which our Catholic faith calls us. Lastly, on behalf of the staff of St. Joseph's, I wish you a very Blessed Holy Week, Easter, and Easter Octave for your family. May you have a safe and peace-filled respite, and may you and your students come back ready for a strong close to an amazing school year.

2023-2024 Online Registration is Now Open!

We are excited to announce that St. Joseph's online enrollment is now open!! Online Registration is like last year: you **MUST** have a Parent Portal Account in order to enroll your child(ren) for next year.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>:

We are changing how we distribute our important documents: Tuition Agreement and ACH, Emergency Contact Form (for 23-24), and the Computer Acceptable Use Policy (for 23-24). **Once your online registration has been done for your WHOLE family you will then receive your copies of the important documents mentioned previously.** Tuition Agreements and Emergency Contact Forms will be prepopulated with the information we have on file. It is up to you to make the necessary changes on those forms so we have information that is as accurate as possible. We will use PowerSchool and these forms to make sure our School Directory and class distribution lists for teachers for next year are accurate. These forms will be distributed once a week to the families who have finished their registration process for the whole family.

This year it is VERY important to register your child(ren) online. Without registering your child(ren) you will not receive the important documents for the 2023-24 school year. Without registering online, and returning the completed important documents, your family will not be on our posted class lists this August. Please make sure to register your family online as soon as you can to help with a smooth transition into summer.

Online Registration is due by April 28. Tuition Agreements are due by May 19.

Although dental exams are recommended for all students, only those students in preschool, and grades 1, 2, 3, 4, and 7 will be screened. Uniform Review

As we are well into second semester, students are continuing to grow spiritually, emotionally, academically and *physically*! Some boys' pants and girls' jumpers/skirts are looking shorter because the children are growing. Please check your child's uniforms and visit our used uniform selection if needed. We also have a uniform fund for any of you who need financial assistance with purchase of new jumpers/skirts. Contact the school office if you are in need. If you are in doubt about anything, please check the school <u>dress code</u> as found on our website. Reminders will be emailed in the near future if we see children still in need. A few other dress code items for your attention include:

- **Girls Uniform:** Length must be no shorter than one inch from the floor when kneeling.
- Solid black, navy blue, or white socks or tights must be worn with shoes or sandals all year long; only small logos (no stripes) when worn with shorts, jumpers, or skirts.
- Boys' hair should be relatively short (long hair styles are not permitted). Hair should not touch the eyebrows in the front or the collar in the back. Sideburns and hair covering the ear should be no longer than halfway down the ear on the sides. Boys must be clean shaven (no facial hair).
- Girls may wear small earrings, one on each earlobe. For safety reasons, they may not wear hoops, dangles or earrings that hang below the earlobe.


We will also be hosting our usual "8's on A" high school summer league in June as well at Pius X. More information will be coming out for that soon.
