Dear Parents,


As of today, we sit at the <u>44</u> of 45 mark for Kindergarten registrations that would enable us to hire a third teacher. As a reminder, we need to reach this point by <u>April 15</u>. After that date, we will cap registration in Kindergarten at 46, so that the two classrooms do not exceed 23 each, in number. I'll continue to keep you updated on this metric as I know many are interested and hopeful that we may be able to have three sections going into the fall of 2024-'25. *We encourage any families who have not done so to register soon!*

2024-2025 Registration Open!

Saint Joseph's online enrollment is now open for grades K-8!! Online Registration is like last year: you **MUST** have a Parent Portal Account in order to enroll your child(ren) for next year.

**We are changing how we distribute our important documents: Tuition Agreement and ACH, Emergency Contact Form (for 24-25), and the Computer Acceptable Use Policy (for 24-25). Once your online registration has been done for your WHOLE family you will then receive your copies of the important documents mentioned previously. Tuition Agreements and Emergency Contact Forms will be prepopulated with the information we have on file. It is up to you to make the necessary changes on those forms so we have information that is as accurate as possible. We will use PowerSchool and these forms to make sure our School Directory and class distribution lists for teachers for next year are accurate. These forms will be distributed once a week to the families who have finished their registration process for the whole family.

This year it is VERY important to register your child(ren) online. Without registering your child(ren) you will not receive the important documents for the 2024-25 school year. Without registering online, and returning the completed important documents, your family will not be on our posted class lists this August. Please make sure to register your family online as soon as you can to help with a smooth transition into summer.

Online Registration is due by April 29th.

Tuition Agreements are due by May 20th.

NOTES FROM THE NURSE:

***REMINDER: Dental screenings will take place April 5th. Please continue to turn in a <u>dental form</u> for your student(s). These can also be e-mailed to <u>christina-wahlmeier@cd</u> or faxed to 402.489.3260.

PRE-K PARENTS & 6th GRADE PARENTS: students entering <u>Kindergarten</u> and <u>7th grade</u> are required to have a <u>physical exam</u> completed within 6 months of the first day of school as well as an <u>up to date immunization record</u> on file. A copy of the physical and immunization record is due in the school office by the first day of school.

7th GRADE PARENTS: students entering 8th grade that are planning to participate in school organized sports are required to have a sports physical on file. These may be completed after May 1st for the upcoming school year.

MEDICAL FORMS: can be found on the school website located under the <u>Forms</u> tab for the 2024-2025 school year. Non-prescription medication authorizations can also be filled out on PowerSchool.

Pro-Abortion Ballot Initiative

WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT

in the Pro-Abortion Ballot Proposal?



THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

REMOVES PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using all "persons" instead of "women," any girl under the age of 18 could have an abortion without her parent's consent or knowledge.

LEAVES "HEALTH" UNDEFINED

Court cases define "health" exceptions to include motional, psychological, and familial well-being.

THREATENS ALL HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS

The amendment risks eliminating 50 years of common-sense protections for women and girls against unsafe abortion practices. After passing a similar constitutional amendment, Michigan quickly repealed informed consent laws, and state licensing and inspection requirements for abortion facilities.

GIVES ABORTIONISTS THE SOLE DISCRETION TO DECIDE VIABILITY

Women seeking an abortion don't see their OBGYN or family doctor. They go to abortion practitioners. This ballot initiative gives power to abortion practitioners, who may not even be licensed doctors, to decide whether a baby is "viable."

CREATES A RIGHT TO LATE-PREGNANCY ABORTION

Babies born as late as 32-36 weeks need machines to help them breathe. This is an "extraordinary medical measure" necessary for their life outside the womb. Under the ballot proposal language, these babies are not "viable" and may be aborted.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 31

OF THE NEBRASKA STATE CONSTITITION SHALL BE AMENDED TO READ...

"All persons shall have a fundamental right to abortion until fetal viability, or when

needed to protect the life or health of the pregnant patient, without interference from the

state or its political

subdivisions.

Fetal viability means the point

in pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the patient's treating health care

practitioner, there is a significant likelihood of the

fetus' sustained survival outside the uterus without the

application of extraordinary

medical measures."
