Now we are back to sacrifice, service and almsgiving for a few more weeks. I



BIST Tip:
"It's never
okay to be
disruptive."

Being disruptive means you are interfering with learning or being hurtful. A key to a positive learning environment is that students are not disrupting their own learning or that of others. It's true that "kids will be kids." That means that they will sometimes be talking when they shouldn't, mess around with things without thinking or sometimes lash out at others. We understand that. At the same time, we talk with students about what disruption looks like in the classroom – and sometimes act it out – to help them realize how it is not okay. By referring to the Bottom Line when a disruption happens, all children know the expectation and find an easier time following it. This avoids simply "nagging" about negative behavior. What would be your "Bottom Line" at home? Maybe brainstorm with your children what phrase you would use for it and then refer to that terminology when it actually happens. This empowers your children to be

New School Uniform Vendor!

We are pleased to announce that in the upcoming year St. Joseph School has partnered with School Belles as our primary uniform supplier. School Belles is able to replicate our current plaid for the girls jumpers and uniforms. The skirt style is almost identical with our current skirts from Dennis Uniform and the jumper is very similar (primary difference is rounded neck instead of v-neck). Finding comparable jumpers/skirts in our plaid pattern was a challenge and we are very grateful for the moms who helped us research different options for uniform companies. Please know that we are still maintaining our status of a non-exclusive contract with School Belles and are not changing other dress code items at this time. Therefore, any used uniforms are still welcome, as well as pants, shorts and shirts from other vendors. It is only if you need to order new skirts or jumpers that you will need to use School Belles. We are excited to announce that Saint Joseph's online enrollment is now open <u>for Kindergarten through 8th grade</u>!! Online Registration is like last year: you **MUST** have a Parent Portal Account in order to enroll your child(ren) for next year.

**We are changing how we distribute our important documents: Tuition Agreement and ACH, Emergency Contact Form (for 25-26), and the Computer Acceptable Use Policy (for 25-26). Once your online registration has been done for your WHOLE family you will then receive your copies of the important documents mentioned previously. Tuition Agreements and Emergency Contact Forms will be prepopulated with the information we have on file. It is up to you to make the necessary changes on those forms so we have information that is as accurate as possible. We will use PowerSchool and these forms to make sure our School Directory and class distribution lists for teachers for next year are accurate. These forms will be distributed once a week to the families who have finished their registration process for the whole family.

This year it is VERY important to register your child(ren) online. Without registering your child(ren) you will not receive the important documents for the 2025-26 school year. Without registering online, and returning the completed important documents, your family will not be on our posted class lists this August. Please make sure to register your family online as soon as you can to help with a smooth transition into summer.

Online Registration is due by April 18th.

Tuition Agreements are due by May 16th.


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
