very similar (primary difference is rounded neck instead of v-neck). Finding comparable jumpers/skirts in our plaid pattern was a challenge and we are very grateful for the moms who helped us research different options for uniform companies. We are excited to announce that Saint Joseph's online enrollment is now open <u>for Kindergarten through 8th grade</u>!! Online Registration is like last year: you **MUST** have a Parent Portal Account in order to enroll your child(ren) for next year.

**We are changing how we distribute our important documents: Tuition Agreement and ACH, Emergency Contact Form (for 25-26), and the Computer Acceptable Use Policy (for 25-26). Once your online registration has been done for your WHOLE family you will then receive your copies of the important documents mentioned previously. Tuition Agreements and Emergency Contact Forms will be prepopulated with the information we have on file. It is up to you to make the necessary changes on those forms so we have information that is as accurate as possible. We will use PowerSchool and these forms to make sure our School Directory and class distribution lists for teachers for next year are accurate. These forms will be distributed once a week to the families who have finished their registration process for the whole family.

This year it is VERY important to register your child(ren) online. Without registering your child(ren) you will not receive the important documents for the 2025-26 school year. Without registering online, and returning the completed important documents, your family will not be on our posted class lists this August. Please make sure to register your family online as soon as you can to help with a smooth transition into summer.


