### BIST Tip:

### "I can do something even if it's hard or I don't want to."

As one of our BIST Goals for Life, this one hits home with children and adults alike! We all have times that we don't want to do things, but we need to do them anyway. At school, when children are facing challenges, this is a helpful reminder that God gave us the power to choose to do what needs to be done. For children who are hesitant, this is a confidence builder. For children who get easily frustrated, this is a helpful reassurance. For children who get angry, this is a calming reminder. We suggest using this same language at home with your children when circumstances warrant. An effective way to do so is to use a calm voice to remind, then give a little space for the child to think about it. They might be surprised to hear it coming from you, but it will be a great tool to show them that, whether at home or in school, God gives us the tools to make good choices.

### **VOLUNTEER ORIENTATION 2023-2024**

### **Create an Account and Access Training**

Log on to Catholic Mutual Group (CMG) to create an account and to access the training videos. <a href="https://Lincoln.cmgconnect.org">https://Lincoln.cmgconnect.org</a>

### **Requirements for Volunteers**

### Safe Environment Training

Must be completed <u>every</u> year. Log on to your account to see when it expires. NEW volunteers complete the Required Training\*. All others complete the RENEWAL Training OR Safe Environment Training Videos ONLY.

### **Background Check**

Must be done every 5 years. Log on to your account to see when it expires. NEW volunteers complete the Required Training.\* All others complete the Back Ground Check ONLY.

\*The Required Training combines the Safe Environment Training AND a Back Ground Check. Complete this training only if you need BOTH the SE and BGC. Be sure to finish all the way to the end and submit payment. If you need only the SE- do the SE Videos only. If you need just the BGC- do the BGC Only.

### **Requirements for Field Trip Drivers**

### Safe Environment Training and a Back-Ground Check

See above.

### **Defensive Driver Training**

Must be completed 1 time for driving on field trips. Log on to CMG and Scroll down to Optional Trainings.

### **Volunteer Driver Form**

- Can be obtained from Gloria Jundt.\*\*
- Must be filled out every 3 years for driving on field trips
- Must include a copy of front and back of Driver's License, a copy of your current Vehicle Registration, and a copy
  of insurance Liability Limits, which must be \$100,000, \$300,000, \$100,000 (not your insurance card).

### **Preschool:**

Up-to-date immunizations

### Kindergarteners:

Physical with up-to-date immunizations

**7th Graders**: **ALL** 7TH GRADERS NEED A PHYSICAL with up-to-date immunizations.

### Sports:

Sports physicals are required for 8th Grade students participating in school organized sports.

Health screenings will take place September 14. Screenings will include height, weight, vision, and hearing. If your child wears glasses, please be sure he/she has them at school. Required grades for health screenings include Preschool/Pre-K and 1st-4th Grades. Due to the Preschool/Pre-K schedule, some students may be screened on a different date.


### **CK Sisters Outdoor Fall Workday**
