Knightly News from the Assistant Principal

Dear Parents,

I hoped that my first newsletter article could just be focused on the great start to our school year here at St.

Joseph's!

It still can be, but is unfortunately also overshadowed by yesterday's tragedy. Our hearts are heavy, worried, anxious, angry, frustrated...the list



could go on. Will anything I say add to the conversation? I don't know.

But in my heart, I was also pondering the wisdom of Bishop Flavin. For those who may not know, Bishop Glennon Flavin was the bishop of the Lincoln Diocese from 1967-1992. He is the founder of the School Sisters of Christ the King. He is also the one who founded St. Joseph School and Parish! Yesterday was the 30th anniversary of his death. I was reading in his biography about his love for Catholic schools and something he said struck me in a new way in light of yesterday's events. He said,

"A Catholic education contains four R's, and the first is Religion, because it knows that you are made not only for this life but for heaven, and it prepares you for that. It prepares you not only to make a living, but also prepares you to live a life. It prepares you not only for life, it prepares you for eternity."

"It prepares you" jumped out to me.

Like many of you, some of my thoughts have gone to, "How are we prepared? What more do we need to do?" There are very practical things that have come up and we are having those conversations because we want to provide as secure an environment for our students as possible (locked doors, secure entrances during Mass, supervision, law enforcement contacts, reviewing and practicing protocols, etc.) But I know that no matter how much we do, unfortunately it will never "be

enough." I took consolation in Bishop Flavin's words because they reminded me that we are also preparing our children for what is eternal. Our ultimate security is in the arms of Jesus. Yes, we need to do our part to be safe on this side of heaven – of course. Yet, at the end of the day, it's not up to me, to us, or to you as parents, to protect our children from every possible danger. We can't. Life just isn't like that.

It's times like this that I return to the Serenity Prayer. And may Jesus grant strength and serenity to all the hurting families of Annunciation Parish and School.

"God grant me the serenity
to accept the things I cannot change;
courage to change the things I can;
and wisdom to know the difference.
Living one day at a time;
enjoying one moment at a time;
accepting hardships as the pathway to
peace;

taking, as He did, this sinful world
as it is, not as I would have it;
trusting that He will make all things
right
if I surrender to His Will;
that I may be reasonably happy in this
life

and supremely happy with Him forever in the next.

Amen."

BIST Tip:
"I can do
something even if
it's hard or I don't
want to."

As one of our BIST Goals for Life, this one hits home with children and adults alike! We all have times that we don't want to do things, but we need to do them anyway. At school, when children are facing challenges, this is a helpful reminder that God gave us the power to choose to do what needs to be done. For children who are hesitant, this is a confidence builder. For children who get easily frustrated, this is a helpful reassurance. For children who get angry, this is a calming reminder. We suggest using this same language at home with your children when circumstances warrant. An effective way to do so is to use a calm voice to remind, then give a little space for the child to think about it. They might be surprised to hear it coming from you, but it will be a great tool to show them that, whether at home or in school, God gives us the tools to make good choices.


Play Dates with School Pets!
