### BIST Tip – Avoiding Power Struggles

When we get caught in power struggles, we often tell the child:

"You will do as I say!"; "You will stay here until you get this done!" By saying these things, we become part of the problem! We cannot take the child's behavior personally. It is their way of dealing with conflict and regaining some form of control. One way to avoid a power struggle is to defer processing until the child's emotions have calmed down. "I can tell this is hard for you. I'll give you a little time to think about it and come back." Another method is to offer options. "I know you don't want to pick up your room, but you can do something hard even if you don't want to. You can either do it now or you can do it during play time. I'll let you choose."

### 2021-2022 Enrollment



# Alarming Nebraska Health Standards Draft

As you have seen in the recent news, the Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) recently released a first draft of Health Standards. These standards are meant to guide curriculum for all Nebraska schools, including public and non-public schools. The Health Standards are a deeply flawed, ideologically driven document. Should such standards be adopted by schools, children will be placed in peril, many educators will find their professional judgment and conscience under attack, and the culture will move toward a further normalization of child sexualization.

To quote the Omaha World Herald, "Kindergarteners would be taught about different kinds of family structures, including "cohabitating" and samegender families. Fourth-graders would be taught the difference between sex assigned at birth and gender identity. Fifth-graders would be taught that gender expression and gender identity exist along a spectrum. Sixth-graders would learn what sexual identity is and learn about a range of identities related to sexual orientation, among them heterosexual, bisexual, lesbian, gay, queer, two-spirit, asexual and pansexual."

The NDE has asked for comment on these standards and promised revisions. Please take a couple minutes to visit this <u>site</u> to review the <u>standards</u> and take a short survey to share your comments. Because the Catholic schools had no real voice in the advising of these standards, this is our best window to create change.

### **Totus Tuus**

Totus Tuus is a Catholic youth program dedicated to sharing the Gospel and promoting the Catholic faith through teaching, evangelization, Christian witness, and Eucharistic worship. The goal of Totus Tuus is to help young people grow closer to Jesus Christ so He can



lead them to the Father by the power of the Holy Spirit. The program is facilitated by college students and seminarians from the Lincoln Diocese, with the hope of inspiring a true longing for holiness, a desire for conversion, and an openness to their vocation through devotion to Christ through Mary in prayer.
