BIST Tip:

Rethinks

"Rethinks" are quick time outs to help students refocus and get back on track. When a child is off-task, they are asked to put their head down and hide their eyes. The child must be able to identify what got them into trouble in the first place, make a plan of what they can do differently next time, and then demonstrate the appropriate classroom behavior. When the student has finished a "rethink," they let the adult know by giving a thumbs-up signal.

Urgent Pro-life Appeal from Nebraska Catholic Conference

Dear Advocates,

The first round of debate for LB933 is coming up *next week*. Pro-choice advocates are pulling out all the stops to defeat this bill. <u>Have you contacted your state</u> <u>senator yet to urge their support for the bill</u>?


