Parent Virtual Learning Tips

If/when your child needs to learn virtually (especially due to quarantine), the following are some helpful tips for you as parents.



- Things parents can do that are helpful:
 - -Be in the same room
 - -Be able to check with your child on a regular basis
 - -Check to see if the child is completing work
 - -Create a distraction free (minimal distraction) area
- Things parents can avoid that are helpful:
 - -Getting on line to talk directly to the teacher during a lesson
 - -Doing your child's work
 - -Having small children or pets in the same room (they are distracting to other students in the session)
 - -Allowing students to stay in pajamas or be in bed during Zooming


The Student Council uses the money donated to buy gifts for children who don't receive many gifts at Christmas. These gifts will be wrapped and donated to Catholic Social Services.

<u>Christmas Break Extension</u> <u>Being Considered</u>

Catholic school principals in Lincoln are considering an option of extending Christmas break. Knowing that holidays have potential for more extensive outbreaks of COVID-19, we will carefully evaluate the spread after Thanksgiving break and plan to meet next week with Dr. Hecker to determine if it would be wise to allow extra time for Christmas break. What is currently being considered is extending the Christmas break four more days for students and have them come back to school on January 11. The purpose would NOT be to encourage more gathering or traveling, but rather to provide for two full weeks for families to complete quarantines after exposures during Christmas and the following weekend. These would not be remote learning days, but days off for teachers. Please know that this is just one possibility, but since it is being strongly considered we wanted to let you know what is being discussed. We will let you know immediately when something is decided, because we know planning for this possibility could be daunting for our families.

CHANGE IN CALENDAR

We are thrilled to announce that our students get to celebrate our Lord's birth with simplified Christmas concerts! In compliance with COVID-19 rules and regulations this winter's Christmas concerts will be held as follows:

Tuesday, December 15

Wednesday, December 16

Logistics:

- There will be roughly 62 students performing all together at each concert. They will be spread out on the risers/ floor.
- They will be masked when singing and may take their masks off for any solo or speaking part.
- Only parents will be able to come to the concert and all siblings, grandparents, etc. will be able to watch it livestreamed. (specifics to come later)
- After the first concert, the gym will be quickly cleaned before the next group may come in.
- We politely ask that the 6:30 concert-goers park in the back (east) parking lot while the 7:30 concert-goers park in front of the school to avoid congestion between concerts.
- Doors will open approximately 15-20 minutes before show time. Please stay in your cars until the doors open.

Specifics may change or be altered depending on where we are with COVID-19 guidelines in the middle of December.

Meals for the Sisters


