Dear Mr. Naumann,

I'm not sure how genuine a person could be, but whatever the most is that's what this is. I am extremely sorry to you and to whom these recent events may concern. I am sorry for vandalizing St. Joseph's property including parts of the playground, the library box in the front, the handicapped sign, the moving of the table, and the words and images written on the snow near the playground on those nights. I am sorry for ruining the experiences of the kids who actively use that playground equipment. I am sorry for the SFA members who spent years designing the new equipment, and resulting in us destroying it. I am sorry to the faculty who feel threatened because of our actions. I am sorry to the parents who are worried about the safety of their children because of these events. I am sorry to Fr. McCabe who manages the parish and school to be the recipient of our inappropriate actions. I am sorry to the law enforcement who had to be involved with this. And I am sorry to the parish body as a whole, who had to have witnessed this. None of the actions that happened these nights should go excused. All deserve the correct punishment. All of the consequences will be recognized and follow through by us. I believe I speak on behalf of the four of us that were there those nights and that I apologize to all who were affected and actions like this or any negative actions toward the parish will never happen again.
