Winter Outdoor Recess Policy

In consultation with teachers and staff, the winter outdoor recess policy has recently been revised regarding temperature. The highlighted items below are changes to the original policy. This will go into effect immediately. To review other recess guidelines, see the parent handbook on pages 20-22. Thank you for sending your children properly dressed for cold weather!

Blacktop

- When the blacktop is ice covered, students will have indoor recess.
- When the blacktop is snow covered, teachers will use discretion to determine if recess will be outdoors.

Temperature

- Teachers always have the option to take students outside for brief periods of fresh air.
- When the temperature, with wind chill, is below 10 degrees, students will have indoor recess.
- When the temperature, with wind chill, is between 10 and 20 degrees, students will go outside for part of the recess. The time will be determined by playground teacher discretion.
- When the temperature, with wind chill, is above 20 degrees, students will have outdoor recess.

We need to love those who are confused, but we certainly don't need to promote confusion for our children! In addition, this article was recently shared with our Catholic school principals about the content of some of these books. We know that most book companies probably offer a diversity of titles and genres, but there is a difference between actively promoting alternative lifestyles and simply having books on the shelves.
