One of the blessings I have at our Ash Wednesday Mass, is to be allowed to assist in the distribution of ashes. Christ calls each of us and marks us with the ashen cross, as his own, in life and in death. 2023-2024 Online Registration is Now Open!

We are excited to announce that St. Joseph's online enrollment is now open!! Online Registration is like last year: you **MUST** have a Parent Portal Account in order to enroll your child(ren) for next year.

PLEASE NOTE:

We are changing how we distribute our important documents: Tuition Agreement and ACH, Emergency Contact Form (for 23-24), and the Computer Acceptable Use Policy (for 23-24). **Once your online registration has been done for your WHOLE family you will then receive your copies of the important documents mentioned previously.** Tuition Agreements and Emergency Contact Forms will be prepopulated with the information we have on file. It is up to you to make the necessary changes on those forms so we have information that is as accurate as possible. We will use PowerSchool and these forms to make sure our School Directory and class distribution lists for teachers for next year are accurate. These forms will be distributed once a week to the families who have finished their registration process for the whole family.

This year it is VERY important to register your child(ren) online. Without registering your child(ren) you will not receive the important documents for the 2023-24 school year. Without registering online, and returning the completed important documents, your family will not be on our posted class lists this August. Please make sure to register your family online as soon as you can to help with a smooth transition into summer.

Online Registration is due by April 28. Tuition Agreements are due by May 19.

Updated Medical Forms can be found on the school website located under the Forms tab for the 2023-2024 school year.

- Incoming Kindergarteners and Incoming 7th graders are required to have <u>physical exams</u> <u>completed within 6 months of the first day of school</u> as well as <u>updated immunization records</u>. Forms can be turned into the office now through the start of the 2023-2024 school year.
- 8th graders participating in sports will also need an updated physical exam (7th grade physicals do not count for this requirement).

Please reach out if you have any questions regarding health requirements for the 2023-2024 school year.

It is **school policy that your child needs to be **symptom free** (NO FEVER OR VOMITING) FOR 24 HOURS without the aid of fever-reducing medication **BEFORE RETURNING TO SCHOOL** and/or participating in school organized events.
