2020-2021 Tentative Calendar

We have updated our <u>tentative calendar</u> for next school year with most dates being completed as we prepare for summer. Please note the following:

- *Picture Day* will be held before school starts, on the same day as the Ice Cream Social, **August 13**. In August, you will be receiving a sign-up link to schedule when you want to bring your children for pictures on that day. If you are out of town, there will still be a retake day later in the semester. If COVID-19 affects the start of our school year in the fall (which we pray it won't!), we have an *alternate* Picture Day on September 11.
- Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation that were not completed this spring will be scheduled for the fall semester (probably September or October). This will not affect next year's classes who will still receive those sacraments in the spring, as usual.
- Half Days are still included in the calendar, but there are fewer of them than in the past due to Diocesan guidelines. Note in particular that the last day before Christmas break and the last day of school are now full days.
