## **Knightly News from the Principal**

Dear Parents,

As we approach the holidays of Halloween, All Saints Day and All Souls Day, it is amazing to me the predominance of the former, over the life of the nation. Radio stations count down to Halloween now, and displays in yards far exceed anything at Christmastime or Easter. I guess it is a sign of the times. As Catholics, however, the Feast of All Souls holds a special place in the lifeblood of the Church into antiquity. Sadly for us, the practice of

praying for our beloved dead, or more generally for the souls in purgatory, has diminished since the Second Vatican Council, although nowhere in the documents do the Fathers and bishops of the Council exhort the people of God to no longer pray for the deceased. One hard and fast rule of Church councils: Never contradict anything that has come from previous councils.

The belief that some souls need to be cleansed or purged after death is scriptural and has been a part of Church teaching since it's earliest recorded history. We know that some souls need purification after death in order to attain the "Beatific Vision" (Heaven) and these souls benefit greatly from our prayers and good works performed on their behalf. We owe it to these deceased family and friends to help them to move closer and closer to the glory of Heaven. Our students can participate in this as well. The offering of Holy Mass is paramount, followed by the recitation of the rosary, or part of it, on their behalf. Finally, offering of small sacrifices throughout the week on the behalf of a loved one, or even a forgotten soul, are all ways for our students to connect with this tradition. It is certain that our dead brothers and sisters, known or unknown, want, need and deserve our prayers and offerings on their behalf. We pray that their gratitude will not be forgotten when one day we embrace those whose journey to Our Lord was aided by our faithful efforts and those of our children. May God bless you.

#### **Important Dismissal Notice**

If you pick up your child in the back of school, please **DO NOT** move the cones from the parking lot entrance. We know that earlier in the year, there were some glitches with getting these moved, but we need them to stay across the entrance for the safety of students who have recess in the late afternoon and run to line up by the school doors. **Please do not enter the parking lot before 3:10.** If it is after 3:10 and you notice they have not been moved, please call the school office at 402-489-0341. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

#### **MEDICATION ALERT!**

If you use prescription or non-prescription medication for your children, please be extra careful to purchase it from a reliable pharmacy and not other online vendors. Unfortunately, imitation medications laced with deadly Fentanyl are on the increase, even in Nebraska. In January of this year, Nebraska Law Enforcement seized enough Fentanyl on I-80 to kill every Nebraskan. From 2018 to January of 2023, Nebraska State Patrol has seized 267 pounds of Fentanyl. With the increase in deadly Fentanyl being

discovered in the 58.4 million fake pills seized by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) in 2022 and the continued opioid crisis, we are looking into keeping doses of Narcan on hand at school. This drug can temporarily reverse the overdose effects of legal and illicit drugs like Adderall laced with Fentanyl, Xanax, Oxycodone, and Fentanyl. We are not so much concerned that our students are taking illegal drugs, but the sad fact is that legal medications laced with Fentanyl are being sold to unsuspecting customers, with deadly effects. We pray for St. Michael's protection for our children, but also want to be prepared in the case of an emergency. 

# BIST Tip: "ICE" Language

No, this is not the same as a cold shoulder! Rather, it stands for, "I see... Can you... Even though..." For children who find it difficult to follow directions, or follow directions the first time, this language helps to avoid a power struggle. Instead of saying, "Start on your homework," or "Clean your room," you can say, "I see you're not started yet. Can you get started, Even though you don't feel like it?" By turning the situation into a question, children often feel more empowered rather than belligerent. Try this the next time you need to remind your children to do something they are avoiding and see how they respond.

the aid of medication, prior to returning to school. Thank you for helping to keep our students healthy!


