
On their pilgrimage they prayed many prayers called Psalms. They praised God for being so good. They told God they were sorry for all the sins in the world.


They thanked God for giving them gifts of life and health and family. They asked God for things they needed like food and good weather and to heal friends who were sick.




At home, St. Joseph thanked God for a safe pilgrimage. He thanked God for loving him. He thanked God for trusting him to care for Mary and Jesus.





A sacrifice is giving up something you want or doing something hard for the sake of another. Maybe you can let someone else go first in line or not complain when you are tired. Maybe you could eat less of something you like or give up dessert. Maybe you could talk to or play with someone who is alone. Maybe you could do chores at home beforehand to earn money to give to the poor.



When you go on a pilgrimage remember to serve.

To serve is to give of yourself. Serving can be big or small. Holding the door is a way to serve. Picking up trash is a way to serve. Smiling or offering to help someone is a way to serve. When you are busy looking for ways to serve others you find that it makes you happier too.



When you come back from a pilgrimage remember to thank God. He will give you many graces and blessings when you make a holy trip like this. He will share His love in special ways. Make sure you remember to tell Him, "Thank You!"



But there's one more secret to learn about a pilgrimage. Our whole life is a pilgrimage! That's right, every day we are all on a journey getting closer and closer to the holiest place you can imagine. Every day we pray, we sacrifice and we serve. Every day we thank God for His gifts.
