“Whatever you do, do from the heart, as for the Lord and not for others, knowing that you will receive from the Lord the due payment of the inheritance; be slaves of the Lord Christ.” (Col.3:23, 24)

Through service, our students learn a sense of compassion for others leading to a desire to contribute to the greater good of the community and carry out the work of Christ.

General Guidelines for Service Projects:

- 1) Service hours are **mandatory**; students will be recognized in school when they have completed the designated hours for their grade. All students are encouraged to go beyond the minimum.
 - Students in 5th-6th grades who go on to complete **40+ total hours** will receive a service pin and certificate during a monthly acknowledgement after Mass, usually on the third Thursday of the month. (Service pins may be worn with uniforms.)
 - They may receive subsequent certificates for **70 and 90+ hours**.
- 2) Service time is NOT to be paid time, but if the student receives money, it should be given to the missions.
- 3) Service during school hours may be done during recess time, before or after school, and study hall.
- 4) Half of service hours may be completed during the summer before the school year for which they are being counted.
- 5) The service log must be completed and turned in **by the last school day in April**.
- 6) Try to do service in more than one area.
- 7) These service hours count for required 5th grade Confirmation service hours.
- 8) Altar Servers can claim up to 4 hours per school year.
- 9) Mission Club, Youth Choir, and Melodic Knights can claim up to 4 hours per school year.
- 10) Musicians at Mass can claim up to 8 hours per school year.
- 11) Student Council, Boy and Girl Scouts, and 4H cannot be counted, but some of their service can, like buying and wrapping presents for donation, making blankets for donation, or collecting canned goods for donation.
